Refunds: until August 15, refunds on entries minus Office fee. **NO REFUNDS** after <u>August 15</u>, including stabling & overpayments, for any reasons including cancellations due to Act of God, acts of terrorism, inclement weather and/or other emergencies or non-compliance with SafeSport eligibility. No refunds for amounts less than \$20.

GAIG/USDF Q fees refunded, if request received before start of class until end of competition (unless applied to other indebtedness); otherwise, will be paid to USDF.

Credit Card dispute, chargeback or withdrawal: \$50 per dispute, chargeback and /or withdrawal After **Closing Date**: August 15 until check-in day, if a competitor has tested positive for COVID-19, has symptoms or has been in contact with COVID-19, upon written (via email) notification, refunds minus \$40 fee will be provided. After arrival at show grounds, if a competitor has tested positive for COVID-19, has symptoms or has been in contact with COVID-19, upon written (via email) notification, only class fees for classes not ridden will be refunded.

**2023 USEF MEMBERSHIP/SHOW PASS RULES for Non-Members -- Important Change

Non-member participants in the role of riders, drivers, handlers, vaulters, longueurs, owners, lessees, and agents must pay a Show Pass fee. Competitions cannot accept payment for a Show Pass from exhibitors. Show Pass purchases can only be made online on the USEF website by exhibitors. Non-member participants in the above roles are limited to obtaining **no more than one (1) Show Pass per competition year** (ie: December 1, 2022-November 30, 2023). To be eligible to participate at Federation Licensed Competitions, all persons acting as coaches or trainers, and legal guardians signing entry blanks as coaches or trainers on behalf of their minors must be Senior Active Members in good standing.

The online Show Pass form is available on the USEF website at https://www.usef.org/show-pass

The Show Pass form cannot be completed until a competition start date is within the next 14 days or if the show is currently in progress. The Show Pass must be completed prior to competing. Make sure to check current rules on website. Show secretary is notified of show passes.

Please note: USEF/USEF membership and horse ID requirements are not required for Intro Level/Opportunity class dressage.

USEF WAIVER FORMS REQUIRED

EVERYONE (riders, owners/agents, trainers, coaches, officials, staff, volunteers and any others) MUST sign a USEF Waiver Form (on last page of Prize List). No one may enter the grounds without a signed waiver form.

SAFE SPORT

All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at <u>www.usef.org</u>.

All adult USEF active members must complete the SafeSport Training in order to compete. Please go to your dashboard on www.USEF.org to complete this training.

For this show, horses and/or riders entered in opportunity class(es) may not be entered in any other class(es) in the show except Introductory levels.

ENTRY PROCEDURES AND INFORMATION

Entry Information Requirements: Competitors are responsible to provide valid membership numbers on the entry form for all horse, owner, rider, and trainer names listed on the entry form. **Only one horse-rider combination per entry form.** USEF and USDF registration is verified electronically if valid membership numbers are provided on the entry form. Safe Sport Training must have been completed for USEF memberships to be valid. You may be asked to provide copies of your membership documents, if your memberships cannot be verified for any reason.

All hard copy entries must include copies of all memberships for horse, owner, rider and trainer listed on entry form. NO MAILED ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT MEMBERSHIP CARD COPIES & COGGINS.

USEF SAFE SPORT TRAINING REQUIREMENT: If you are a USEF Competing Member 18 years of age or older you are required to complete the core Safe Sport Training within 30 days of activating your membership. If you do not complete the training, you are ineligible to participate in all USEF activities including competitions. TAKE the SAFE SPORT TRAINING at USEF.org by logging into your member dashboard.

Entries may be submitted via postal mail, with a check or money order for payment, as well as all the documentation below. Send to the Secretary: Shannon Bossung (see front of prize list). Do NOT send signature required.

- Entries: may be submitted using Equestrian Entries (EqE) at <u>www.EquestrianEntries.com</u>. With this online system, riders and owners agree that they have read the OFFICIAL PRIZE LIST and agree to follow all the class specifications, requirements and conditions therein.
- Through EqE, the rider submits:
- (1) Entry form
- (2) Full payment
- (3) USEF Federation Entry Agreement <u>with ALL three signatures</u> (rider, owner, trainer and parent/guardian if applicable) AND signed USEF Waiver,
- (4) Current negative Coggins
- (5) Proof of rider and owner USEF and USDF Memberships (or pay USDF non-member fee{see above concerning USEF Show Pass rules}) Opportunity and Intro are exempt from NM fee.
- (6) Proof of horse USDF Registration and USEF Recordation (Opportunity and Intro are exempt)
- (7) Safe Sport Training completion (if adult—owner/rider/trainer)
- (8) ERAHC waiver/release form

- (9) Any required documentation (proof of a qualifying score for MFS classes, etc.) Entries without <u>both</u> the
 (1) complete entry form and (2) full payment will not be entered in the show until received.
- Items (5) and (6) may also be submitted via the printed report from <u>www.eqverification.org</u>.
- If complete documents (3), (4), (5), (6) and (7) are not submitted via EqE, may be submitted via snail mail (do <u>not</u> use a signature required service) sent to the Show Secretary or as an email attachment sent to SGP588@hotmail.com (the email SUBJECT line must state the email is related to the ERAHC show).
- All Emergency numbers will be posted in/outside the Secretary's office and in the barns.
- **Riders** may substitute horses once they have entered only upon presentation of a Vet Certificate for the incapacitated horse, or a bill-of-sale, and only in classes in which the first horse was entered. The Secretary must be notified 24 hours before the class(es) take(s) place, and a new entry form must be completed.
- **FULL SHOW:** Entries may be limited if numbers exceed capacity of the facility. The show may fill prior to the closing date. Entries received after the show is full will be placed on a waiting list.
- LATE ENTRIES: Late entries (received by the show secretary after midnight of the August 11 date) will be accepted on a space available basis.
- Virginia law requires a current health certificate for horses arriving from out of state. Your horse cannot be stabled on the grounds without a health certificate.
- All Competitors must submit with their entry current proof (Within 6 Months of the first day your Horse enters the Competition Grounds) of Equine Influenza and Rhinopneumonitis Vaccination for All Horses 7 Months of Age or Older. A current Coggins within 12 Months must also be submitted
- Submit completed <u>2023 Dressage</u> entry forms and fees for each horse separately to the Show Secretary. Entries will be limited if the number of entries exceed facility capacity. In the event of oversubscription, a waiting list will be established.
- ERAHC will not be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors, spectators, or grooms. Include signed **ERAHC Waiver** sheet with Entry Forms
- Any entry received after August 11 date is a Post Entry and may be accepted at the discretion of show management. If accepted, the entry will be assessed a \$50 surcharge.
- Non-Competing Horse: Must submit completed and signed Entry form to the Show Secretary, show proof of current Coggins and Flu/Rhino vaccine, sign USEF Waiver, and pay NC Horse fee plus Office fee. Grounds or stabling fees are also required. USEF/USDF fees or Late fee NOT required.

Virginia Law

Under Virginia law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting exclusively from the inherent risks of equine activities.

CODE OF VIRGINIA TITLE 3.1 AGRICULTURE, HORTICULTURE AND FOOD, CHAPTER 27.5. EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT, VA. Code Ann. 3.1-796.130 (1994)

• Hold Harmless Clause The Equine Activity Liability laws of the State of Virginia, VA Code Ann. Sec 3.2-6200-6203 state among its statutory provisions that, "NOTICE: Intrinsic dangers in equine activity, include (i) the propensity of equines to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm, or death to persons on or around them; (ii) the unpredictability of an equine's reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement, and unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals; (iii) certain hazards such as surface and subsurface conditions; (iv) collisions with other animals or objects; and (v) the potential of a participant acting in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the equine or not acting within the participant's ability. "No Participant nor any participant's parent, guardian, or representative shall have or make any claim against or recover from any equine activity sponsor, equine professional, or any other person for injury, loss, damage, or death of the participant resulting from any of the intrinsic dangers of equine activities. It is further understood that each owner, spectator, and other participants assume any and all risks of loss or injury and agrees to hold harmless, regardless of negligent acts or omissions The Virginia Horse Center, USDF, USEF, its instructors, officers, directors, agents, show management, show committee, and all other horse show personnel.


Musical Freestyle Requirement:

- Riders must submit with their entry a copy of the highest test of the level entered or higher level with a minimum score of 63% in USEF levels, 60% in FEI levels, in accordance with USEF rule
- Competitors must provide music on good quality CDs to the announcer at least 2 hr. prior to scheduled time for ride. You may email a mp3 of your music to our announcer Charles Pinnell at <u>charlesrpinnell@gmail.com</u> ahead of time. Times for sound checks will be announced at the show. Please check Show Office.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.



General Information

- "EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH. CURRENT USDF, USEF, AND FEI TESTS WILL BE USED."
- Horse Show Executive Committee: This committee reserves the right to itself, to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Any question not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by this

committee and their decision to be final. The Committee shall consist of the Show Manager, Show Secretary, USEF Show Steward and Representative from IALHA.

- ERAHC will not be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors, spectators, or grooms. Include signed **ERAHC Waiver** sheet with Entry Forms
- Once entered, owners may substitute an entrant only upon submission of a veterinary certificate verifying the horse's illness/injury or proof that the entrant has been sold. In the event of a substitution, the show secretary must be notified at least 24 hours before the show date and a new entry form must be completed prior to the start of the class. A substitution must be for the exact class scheduled; otherwise, it will be considered a new entry.
- **No Shows** may be considered a scratch for the remainder of the dressage show and the next entrant on the waiting list may be given their spot.
- Proper attire will be required of all exhibitors. See DR-120.
- All domestic animals (dogs and cats) must be securely tied, caged, in a closed stall, or on a leash held by a responsible person at all times while on the show grounds or in the stable area. The show will assess a \$100 fine on owners of loose dogs. USEF may levy additional penalties for loose dogs. See GR-1301.6.
- Sharps Containers: Red receptacles are available in the barn area and MUST be used for disposal of needles and other Disposable sharp instruments. It is a felony to place medical trash/sharps in the manure pits. The fine for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments is \$1000, imposed on any individual, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents.
- **No smoking** is allowed in the barn areas or in any buildings at VHC. Anyone found smoking in the barn area will be fined \$100.
- Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is being exercised, walked, or ridden.
- Fly hoods/ear covers are permitted for all classes (indoors and outdoors). Fly hoods (ear covers) are permitted for all classes in order to protect horses form insects. The fly hood should be discreet in color and design and should not cover the horse's eyes. After completion of the test, the rider or his representative is responsible for removing the fly hood to present the designated ring steward for inspection to ensure that nothing prohibited has been added. USEF DR 121.7.
- **Management** reserves the right to cancel, split, or combine classes. In the event of over subscription, entries will be limited. Classes may be split into AA or Jr/YR if there are 5 or more AA or Jr/YR entries in the class.
- **Trainers**: Email your **"Stable With"** list and stall order to show secretary at least seven days before show.
- Show Office Hours: Noon—7pm Tuesday, 7am—7 pm Wednesday, 7am—1 hour after show ends on Thursday. These are anticipated hours.
- Hospitality: Food available on site during show hours.
- Show Fines: The following fines will be enforced by the show on all exhibitors, competitors and spectators in violation of local rules: Loose dog/cat without leash: \$100. No Smoking in the barn area: \$100. Improper disposal of medical or hazardous waste: \$1000. Suspending or hooking anything to electrical conduit: \$1000.
- **Camping Facilities:** Limited camping facilities and hook-ups are available at the Horse Center. For reservation, please contact VHC at 540-464-2966, or e-mail: <u>stableoffice@horsecenter.org</u>

STABLING

- Andalusian/Lusitano Competitors: Need to include with Dressage entry the information on their Virginia Classic Andalusian/Lusitano show entry's stabling information with their choice of stalls and who to be stabled with.
- Stabling will NOT be posted. Check in at the VHC stabling office for stall assignments: No horse may be unloaded prior to checking in with the stable office. You must include an emergency contact (for the rider) and phone # on your entry blank "Stable With" list and stall order must be emailed to the show secretary at least seven days before show. Lay over policy: For Thurs night must coordinate through the VHC Stable Office and pay separate fee.
- **Bedding and Hay:** No initial bedding. Bedding available for purchase from VHC stable Office. Preorders of five bags or more of shavings can be made by contacting VHC at 540-464-2966 or <u>stableoffice@horsecenter.org</u>. Delivery prior to arrival is not a guaranteed. Exhibitors permitted to bring shavings for personal use, but no fine sawdust allowed.
- Permanent stalls: (12'x10') with doors; initial bedding not provided. All stalls must be bedded. Shavings and other supplies (hay, grain, etc.) may be ordered through the VHC: 540-464-2966. Do not hook or suspend anything from electrical conduits. There is a \$1000 for any infraction. Emergency contact information must be prominently displayed on all stalls housing an animal, including both cell phone and local contact information. No arrivals allowed between midnight and 7 am. Do not use stalls you have not paid for: this includes waiting in an un-used stall prior to your class. Penalty: \$100 per incident.
- Arrival/Departures: Tuesday, Aug 22 after 12:00 pm (noon) Departures: Thursday, Aug. 24 before 8:00 pm. (unless staying for the Breed show). If needed earlier, please contact Show Secretary. For Sunday night you must coordinate through the VHC Stable Office and pay separate fee.

AWARDS

- **Ribbons:** will be awarded for classes with six or more entries. Prizes for each first place. Jr/YR and AA divisions may be pinned separately, if warranted by at least three entries each.
- **High Score ribbons**: given for the highest score in all following Training through FEI classes. Scores from Introductory, Opportunity, Dressage Seat Equitation, and Musical Freestyles will not be considered. Additional Overall for Professional, Adult Amateur, and Jr/YR
 - There will be no mandatory prize-giving (awards) ceremonies except as noted below

• IALHA High Score Award: To be eligible horses must be registered with IALHA and shown by an IALHA member (as either owner or rider). You will need to include your horses' registration papers with your entry forms. The award requires a photo for the sponsor.

• USPRE High Score Awards: for all PRE registered horses. You will need to include your USPRE registration papers with your entry form to be eligible. Awards for the following: Open (Tr. through Fourth Level); Open FEI Level; Adult Amateur (Tr. Through Fourth Level); Adult Amateur (FEI Level) The award requires a photo for the sponsor.

Use of Protective Headgear

From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non -competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, MUST WEAR **PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR** as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR-801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet, which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tail coat (only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hat covers (where applicable) and must otherwise conform to DR-120 (see GR-801).

Motor Vehicle Operation

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Attention Competitors as of January 1, 2019, if you are a USEF competing member 18 years of age or older you are required to take the core Safe Sport Training within 30 days of activating our membership. Take the Safe Sport Training at USEF.org by logging into your member dashboard.

- 1. Upon arrival at the Virginia Horse Center, all trailers MUST check in at the Welcome Center (Stable Office).
- 2. No smoking in Coliseum or Barns. This is the law.
- 3. VEHICLES: Drive Carefully. Obey All Traffic Signs. Speed limits are strictly enforced. Every vehicle operator must have a valid driver's license and proof of insurance. The use of vehicles in the camping areas is restricted to regular roadways for entering and exiting only. Vehicles are permitted only if operated in a safe manner (this is a Virginia state law), but may not be used in the Coliseum or in the interior of any of the barns. Four wheelers and ATV's are not permitted on the VHC grounds. Non-powered scooters, bicycles, skateboards, in-line skates, heelers (skates in shoes) are not permitted in the Coliseum or the interior of any of the barns. The VHC reserves the right to prohibit the operation of any vehicle.
- 4. **Dogs/Pets:** All dogs/pets must have current inoculations for rabies as prescribed by state of residency. No loose dogs/pets are allowed anywhere on the premises. All dogs/pets that are not crated must be on a handheld or tied leash. Loose dogs/pets will incur a \$100 fine. You must clean up after your dog/pet.
 - **Coliseum:** Absolutely no dogs/pets allowed in the Coliseum unless they are crated or are Service Dogs. Absolutely no dogs/pets in the Mezzanine (2nd floor of the Coliseum) under any circumstances with the exception of Service Dogs. We ask that your Service Dog have his/her vest on.
 - Grounds/Parking Areas/Barns/East Complex: All dogs/pets must be on a hand-held or tied leash.
- 5. No trash or sharps in the manure pits. Sharps should be placed in red boxes in barns.
- 6. All stalls must have at least one bale of shavings or straw. Sawdust is prohibited. Shavings may be purchased at the Welcome Center (Stable Office).
- 7. No lunging in posted rings. Wiley, Speed, and B Rings NEVER.
- 8. No overnight horses may be stabled in trailers or tied out.
- 9. Horses are absolutely not allowed to be ponied behind any moving vehicles
- 10. No vehicles allowed in the barns.
- 11. Campers must register at Stable Office.
- 12. Check-In time and Check-Out time subject to show date.
- 13. No gray water is to be dumped on the ground. Sewage arrangements are made through the stable office.
- 14. Campfires are not permitted.
- 15. Campers must keep their sites clean and dispose of refuse in the receptacles provided. All campers will be responsible for leaving the campsite as they found it. Any damage or repairs resulting from negligence shall be the responsibility of the camper.
- 16. All central service buildings and other facilities in the campground are for campers' and exhibitors' use only.
- 17. Firearms and fireworks are not permitted.
- 18. No tent, camper, RV or camping equipment shall be left unattended longer than 24 hours without written permission from campground management.
- 19. Any loss, theft, accident or disturbance should be reported to the Virginia Horse Center Security. Lost and Found is located in the Security Office.
- 20. Virginia Horse Center management reserves the right to remove from the premises any camper or visitor who is in violation of these rules and regulations.
- 21. The Virginia Horse Center shall be held harmless against all claims, costs, losses or liability of every nature and kind asserted against or incurred by camper arising or resulting in any respect from camper's occupancy and use of premises, and/or visitor and visitor's use of premises.



USEF SAFESPORT TRAINING REQUIREMENT

- The required Safe Sport Training is on the U.S. Center for SafeSport website and is free for USEF members
- All USEF Competing Members (18 and older) are required to complete SafeSport Training within 30 days of joining or renewing USEF membership
- .The SafeSport training requirement applies to all USEF Competing Senior Members even if competing in classes (such as USEF Opportunity) where USEF membership is not required
- Junior Members (under 18) are not required to complete SafeSport Training at this time.
- If SafeSport Training is not completed by USEF members and certificate provided to the show secretary on or before the first day of competition, there will be NO REFUNDS for entries. This applies to all USEF members (riders, owners, trainers or coaches) for any entry, including those classes where USEF membership is not required.
- Participants (riders, owners, trainers, coaches) who are NOT USEF members are not required to complete SafeSport Training, but must have completed USEF Show Pass (Show Pass can only be used for one competition annually)
- If SafeSport Training is overdue and certificates are not presented to the show secretary, or posted yet on the USEF website, the entry (horse and competitor) will be allowed to remain on the competition grounds but cannot compete.
- Riders, owners, trainers and coaches may compete within 30 days of joining or renewing USEF membership even if they haven't completed SafeSport Training but will not be allowed to compete in another show at the end of the 30 day period if they haven't yet completed the Training.
- Competitions are required to check the USEF SafeSport ineligibility list after entries are submitted and up to the first day of competition. Competitions that allow ineligible participants to compete are subject to penalties by USEF.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT GR901.9

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders

and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a nider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEFlicensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan#/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

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All parts of this Agreement apply to me and each of the children or legal wards listed above. [We will collectively call ourselves, "1", "me", or "my" throughout this Agreement]

IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

1. AGREEMENT TO VOLUNTARILY ASSUME ALL RISKS AND DANGERS UNDER THE VINGINIA EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT / NOTICE OF INTRINSIC DANGERS OF EQUINE ACTIVITIES PURSUANT TO VA CODE ANN. 3.2-6209(B). By signing this Agreement, I affirm that I fully understand and appreciate the risks and dangers inherent in and intrinsic to equine activities. "Intrinsic dangers of equine activities" means those dangers or conditions that are an integral part of equine activities, including: (i) the propensity of equines to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm, or death to persons on or around them; (ii) the unpredictability of an equine's reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement, and unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals; (iii) certain hazards such as surface and subsurface conditions; (iv) collisions with other animals or objects; and (v) the potential of a participant acting in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the equine or not acting within the participant's ability.

2. WAIVER OF RIGHTS TO SUE (AS ALLOWED PURSUANT TO VA. CODE ANN. 3.2-6200-6203: With


full knowledge and appreciation of the intrinsic and inherent risks and dangers of equine activities, and to the fullest extent as may be permitted under Virginia law, I (on behalf of myself and my spouse, parents, heirs, representatives, assigns, minor) agree to each of the following: (a) ERAHC and their members, managers, employees, agents, heirs, family members, assigns, representatives, affiliated persons, volunteers, and others acting on their behalf (hereafter referred to collectively as "The Released Parties") shall not be liable for any losses, injuries, or damages that I may sustain as a result of engaging in any of The Activities at any time or at any location; and (b) I release, waive, and discharge all claims, demands, damages, legal actions, causes of action, or rights of action (present or future) against The Released Parties whether claims are known, unknown, anticipated or unanticipated, and whether caused by their ordinary negligence, a violation of a state equine activity liability act, or other legal liability resulting from or arising out of my/our engaging in The Activities at any time and at any location. The term "damages" in this Agreement means, for example, medical expenses any and all claims or losses because of bodily injuries, mental/emotional injuries, or property damages, death, expenses, and/or personal property damages. This Agreement is intended to apply and be blinding regardless of whether i/we am/are riding, driving, handling, or near equines. THIS AGGREEMENT IS INTENDED TO BE A WAIVER OF RIGHTS TO SUE AS CONTEMPLATED BY THE VIRGINIA EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT, VA. CODE ANN. 3.2-6200-6203, INCLUDING 3.2-6301.B.

3. INDEMNIFICATION. To the fullest extent allowed under Virginia law, I also agree to indemnify and hold harmless The Released Parties against any and all claims, demands, actions, liabilities, losses, or suits that are brought against The Released Parties (or either of them), which are in any way connected with my participation in any of The Activities at any time and at any location, including claims that allege acts or omissions of The Released Parties that are negligent or in violation of a state equine activity liability act. This indemnification shall also include reimbursement of reasonable attorney fees and costs incurred by The Released Parties.
