OPPORTUNIY Class Specifications

Entries may show in other classes at this show if their breeding allows.

- Opportunity Class English Pleasure Hunt Seat Walk/Trot **Open to All Breeds Class344** Horses are to enter the ring at a trot in a counterclockwise direction and are shown both ways of the ring at the walk and trot. Required to halt, stand quietly and in the line-up , back readily either individually or as a group. Judged on performance, manners, type, and quality.
- Opportunity Class Western Pleasure Walk/Jog **Open to All Breeds Class 421** Horses are to enter the ring at a jog trot in a counterclockwise direction and are show both ways of the ring at the walk and jog trot. In the lineup horses must stand quietly and may be asked to back readily. Judged on performance, manners, type, quality, and conformation.
- Opportunity Class Costume Musical Freestyle- gaits of choice- **Open to All Breeds Class 347** Exhibitor must provide music on MP3 or WAV format and a written description of their performance at least 1 hour prior to the class. Performance must be no longer than 4 minutes. This is a fun class and the performance will be judged on riding ability, creativity, and overall impression.
- Opportunity Class Mounted Trail Walk/Jog/Trot Western/English seats-**Open to All Breeds**-**Class - 434** Course will be posted in the Show Office prior to the class and will have a variety of objects to work over and through. Riders will be permitted to inspect the course on foot during the Judge's instructions prior to the start of the class. No schooling of the course is allowed.

Opportunity Class – Gambler's Choice Trails- Walk/Jog/Trot/Lope/Canter – English/Western – **Open to All Breeds** – **Class 435** Each rider has 2 minutes to successfully complete as many obstacles on the Trail's course as he or she can. The 10 obstacles are each worth a specific point value. Riders have to attempt a minimum of 4 different obstacles and may try an obstacle more than once, but not back to back. Ride with highest point total is the winner

General Information

"EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

- ERAHC's classes are scheduled in a tentative **Order of Go** with no time schedule. Exhibitors need to be prepared and listen to the announcements about unfilled classes or very small classes. This will move the Order of Go quickly forward.
- Horse Show Executive Committee will be following USEF rules. This committee reserves the right to itself, to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Any question not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Executive Committee and their decision to be final. The Committee shell consist of the Show Manager, Show Secretary, USEF Show Steward.
- ERAHC reserves the right to refuse an entry for any reason.
- Management reserves the right to **cancel**, **split**, **or combine classes** at their discretion. If combined, individual IALHA Qualifier classes will still be placed and pinned separately.
- **Class Additions:** Classes may be added to entry after closing date without penalty if the class is added by using the Official Form Provided by the Show Office; 1 hour or four classes away from entry to class (whichever comes first). There is a \$20 change fee, if dropping and adding another class.
- ERAHC New England Classic Baroque Show, and Mount Holyoke College Equestrian Center reserve the right to maintain a **Harassment Free Environment** and may remove or refuse entry to any person(s) disrupting the show.
- **Ties** in any class will be determined at the sole discretion of the judge, unless otherwise noted. In classes where USEF rules specify a tiebreak procedure, that rule shall be applied.
- Show Attire: No handler, exhibitor, rider, or driver shall be allowed to enter a class wearing clothing that displays logos or wording that would identify any farm/business/owner/breeder. Jeans or shorts are not acceptable attire for handlers/assistants/horse holders in halter or in hand classes. Please see USEF A/L and FR sections for proper attire for each division. Horses are not allowed to use saddle pads that identify any farm/business/owner or breeder.
- **Dogs** must be securely tied, caged, in a closed stall, or on a leash at all times while on the show grounds or in the stable area. The show will assess a \$100 fine on owners of loose dogs. USEF may levy additional penalties for loose dogs. See GR-1301.6.
- Sharps containers are red and available in the barn area on the road side of the barns and MUST be used for disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments. <u>The fine for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable</u> instruments is \$1000, imposed on any individual, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents.
- Drug Tests: All horses may be drug tested on a random basis. No fee will be collected

Gate Calls and Gate Holds

Due to potential unforeseeable problems with any mechanical device, PA systems, and paddock calls must be considered a courtesy. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be sure that his/her horse is at the entry gate when the class is ready to begin. Every effort will be made to maintain a working PA system or carry class calls; however, no protest will be up held, nor will any class be changed on the basis of a PA malfunction. There may be up to a 6-minute break where classes have been canceled. **The two-minute Gate Rule will be strictly adhered to.** Breaks will be scheduled throughout the show as necessary. *As a courtesy to other competitors, please only enter classes for which you will be able to show up on time.*

Gate Calls: When a class is ready to begin, the Paddock Steward will call for the entries.

- 1. In classes where <u>entries are shown individually</u>, if all entries are not present, **a warning will be issued and the class** will be closed 3 minutes later.
- 2. In classes where horses compete collectively, the class will be closed 2 minutes after the first entry enters the ring.

Gate Holds: Competitors may request a Gate Hold (e.g., for a tack change) from the Paddock Steward for a specific class. Gate Holds will be granted for up to 7 minutes at the discretion of the Paddock Steward and show management. Gate Holds should be requested at least 2 classes prior to the specified class. Gate Hold time will start when the last horse from the previous class leaves the ring. No Gate Holds will be granted after the gate has been opened for the class.

Entry Procedures

USEF Membership Requirements for Entries:

- Competing Membership is only required for athletes seeking HOTY points. Owners seeking HOTY points must be competing members and the horse must have a recording.
- Trainer or coach must be a competing member if signing an entry blank
- Youth competing without a trainer or coach will have a parent sign as trainer or coach and the parent must be a competing member
- All participant in a USEF Lite competition agree to becoming a USEF Fan as a condition of participation in the competition (at no cost to the participant)

Entries may be submitted via postal mail, with a check, money order or credit card for payment, as well as all the documentation below. Send to the Secretary: Sue McKeown (see front of prize list). Do NOT send signature required.

All Competitors must submit with their entry current proof (Within 6 Months of the first day your Horse enters the Competition Grounds) of Equine Influenza and Rhinopneumonitis Vaccination for All Horses 7 Months of Age or Older. A current Coggins within 12 Months must also be submitted

Entries:

- (1) Entry form (can be done online via <u>www.horseshowoffice.com</u> or via snail mail.
- (2) Full payment
- (3) USEF Release, Assumption of Risk, Waiver and Indemnification Form <u>with signatures</u> (rider, owner, trainer and coach, parent/guardian if applicable)
- (4) Junior Riders/Vintage Riders: riders in these classes must indicate their date of birth on the entry form
- (5) Proof of Amateur Status with USEF must accompany Amateur entries
- (6) Coggins
- (7) Copy of all membership cards for Horse/Owners/Exhibitors (IALHA, IFHSA, USEF) (OPPORTUNITY and ALL BREEDS are exempt)
- (8) Photocopy of IALHA Horse Registration (both sides) must accompany each entry in AL, HA, AL/HA classes. Weanlings, Yearlings, and newly imported horses may provide proof or registration of both parents, or documentation of pending IALHA Registration. You may download the IALHA registration papers on line at <u>www.ialha.org</u>. The show committee reserves the right to accept or reject any non-IALHA registration at its discretion Any horse that is later proved unverifiable or unacceptable for IALHA registration must relinquish any titles, placing, prizes, and prize money.

(9) All Friesian and Part Bred Friesian horses must have received a certificate of membership form the International Friesian Show Horse Association (IFSHA) (See FR101)

(10) ERAHC waiver/release form: signed by : Rider/Driver/Handler: Owner; Trainer; Coach(if applicable)

- (11) Additional considerations:
 - They may be submitted via snail mail (do not use a signature required service) sent to the Show Secretary
 - All Emergency numbers will be posted in/outside the Secretary's office and in the barns.
 - **FULL SHOW:** Entries may be limited if numbers exceed capacity of the facility. The show may fill prior to the closing date. Entries received after the show is full will be placed on a waiting list.
- Any entry received after the closing date is a Post Entry and may be accepted at the discretion of show management. If accepted, the entry will be assessed a \$50 surcharge.
- Non-Competing Horse: Must submit completed and signed Entry form and waivers to the Show Secretary, show proof of current Coggins,flu/rhino, and pay Non-Competing Horse fee plus Office fee. Stabling fees may also be required. USEF/IALHA fees or Late fee NOT required
- The office fee is only charged once per horse, regardless of how many classes or types of classes are entered.

Awards & Prizes

The Championship and Reserve Championship: will be awarded to the horses that have place first or second in their halter classes. Only first place winners in the halter classes may be chosen as champion.

- 1. First and second place horses from all classes must compete in their respective championship classes or forfeit their prizes. After the championship has been awarded the second place horse from its age group shall move up to the front line and be judged equally with the remaining first place horses for the reserve championship.
- 2. Third thru sixth place ribbons will be awarded to the remaining entries.
- 3. These championships will have no additional USEF points awarded

Ribbons will be awarded through sixth place in all remaining AL/HA/FR/FRB and OB/AB classes. **Gold Medal Movement Award:** will be presented to the entry with the highest combined walk/trot score in A/L and Half Andalusian halter classes. Amateur to Handle will be not included

ERAHC High Point Awards (Horse-Rider combination): Ribbons will be awarded for the following divisions:

- Andalusian/Lusitano: Open; Amateur; Junior
- Half Andalusian: Open; Amateur; Junior

All prizes and ribbons must be claimed & picked up at the show. No prizes or ribbons will be mailed. Prizes not claimed at the show will be forfeited.

High Point Award Requirements

<u>Note</u>: Horse & rider teams going for High Point Awards or anyone signing up a horse for High Point Award must register in the Show Office at the time of check-in or no later than prior to the start of the Breed Show.

All classes must be indicated.

High Point Performance Awards: will be given to those who accumulate the most points in Performance classes over the two days of the show. Only Performance classes will count for points. Opportunity classes will not be considered.

Point Status:

- Points are based on how many places of a class.
- Amateurs and Juniors may not use Open classes for their total points. o
- Six exhibitors = 1st will get 6 pts., 2nd will get 5 pts., 3rd will get 4 pts., 4th will get 3 pts., 5th will get 2 pts., and 6th will get 1 pt.
- If a class has only two participants: 1st will get 2 pts., 2nd will get 1 pt.

• One person in a class will get 1 point

Stabling Details

- **Stabling assignments** will be emailed to competitors at least a week before the show, and will be posted on <u>www.horseshowoffice.com</u>
- Stabling request must be with the entry (See multi days stable options in Fee Table)
- Bedding: No initial bedding.

- **Permanent stalls:** Approximately 45 permanents (12'x10') with full doors. *All stabling will be in the main barn.* Tack stalls will be allocated on a first come first serve basis. Tack stalls may be requested, but priority given to competing horses. If oversubscribed, tack stalls will be removed from the entry and a refund will be issued. No bedding will be provided.
- Clean-Stall deposit is NOT required. All stall must be stripped on your departure. However, any stall left dirty will be billed \$50 (including tack stalls) per stall. You will be required to leave within 2 hours of your last class.
- **Emergency contact** information must be prominently displayed on all stalls housing an animal, including both cell phone and local contact information. <u>No arrivals between 8 PM and 7 AM</u>.
- Do not use stalls you have not paid for: this includes waiting in an un-used stall prior to your class. Penalty: \$100 per incident

USEF Safe Sport Requirements

Participants in a Lite competition will be under the jurisdiction of the U.S. Center for SafeSport and will be subject to the US. Center of SafeSport Code and USEF Safe Sport Policy and afforded all related protections.

Training is required for:

- Any individual signing an entry blank as Trainer or Coach, must have completed the SafeSport Training prior to the first day of competition.
- Youth competing without a trainer or coach will have a parent sign as trainer of coach and the parent must be a competing member and have completed the SafeSport training.
- Any Competing Federation Member eighteen (18) years of age or older must have completed the SafeSport Training prior to the first day of competition.
- Non-Federation members, competing members under the age of (18), Subscriber members, and Fans are **not** required to complete the SafeSport Training.



Understanding that horse sports may be hazardous and dangerous, even leading to permanent injury or death, each owner, rider, spectator, and other participant assumes any and all risk of loss or injury and agrees to hold harmless, regardless, the horse show personnel and the facility (VHC) hosting the show. ERAHC will not be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors, spectators, or grooms. All local facility rules must be followed.

USEF Equine Vaccination Rule (GR-844)

ALL COMPETITORS MUST SUBMIT WITH THEIR ENTRY CURRENT PROOF (WITHIN 6 MONTHS OF THE FIRST DAY YOUR HORSE ENTERS THE COMPETITION GROUNDS) OF EQUINE INFLUENZA AND RHINOPNEUMONITIS VACCINATION FOR

ALL HORSES 7 MONTHS OF AGE OR OLDER. A CURRENT COGGINS WITHIN 12 MONTHS MUST ALSO BE SUBMITTED. In addition, if you are traveling ACROSS STATE LINES, Federal Law requires that you have a health certificate within 30 days of traveling.

Motor Vehicle Operation

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

USEF Membership Statement

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

Use of Protective Headgear

Except as may otherwise be mandated by local law, the Federation strongly encourages all riders, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear protective headgear with harness secured which passes or surpasses ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. (Exception hunter, jumper, or hunter/jumper competitions refer to GR-801.2) It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee, and Licensed Officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance.
